Newspaper parcels and despatches, half parcel rates, minimum charge, 6d. Furniture and musical instruments, double parcel rates. Carpses, 1s. per mile, minimum charge, £1 10s.

HORSES.

9d. per mile each, minimum charge, £1. Full horse-box, one owner, 2s. per mile, and stud horses, 2s. per mile each.

CARRIAGES.

Carriages, gigs, and dog carts, 9d. per mile, minimum charge, £1. Horses and vehicles to be at the station twenty minutes before the departure of the train by which they are to be despatched; but the department does not guarantee to forward by any particular time or train.

DOGS.

Carriage to be prepaid, 1d. per mile each, minimum charge, 1s. Dogs must be provided

with chains, or other sufficient means to secure them, without which the department will not be responsible for their safety.

EXCESS LUGGAGE IN CHARGE OF PASSENGERS.

First-class passengers allowed 112 lbs. weight free. Second-class passengers allowed 84 lbs. weight free.

For every 28 lbs., or part of 28 lbs., additional:—

Under 10 miles 0s. 9d.
10 to 25 miles 1s. 6d.

Cloak Room charges: Large parcel, 1s., small parcel, 6d., for twenty-four hours; over that time, an extra charge of 3d. per diem on large and 2d. per diem on small parcels to be made.

These charges to be enforced on all parcels arriving at stations addressed "To be left till called for," if such parcels are not taken delivery of in twenty-four hours after arrival at the respective stations.
