## (A.) LAND PURCHASE.

County Churcliff VICTORIA, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and  
 Parish Walloon Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, and so forth.—  
 Date of Purchase 29<sup>th</sup> April 1879  
 Acre 160 acres

WHEREAS, in conformity with the Regulations now in force for the Sale of Crown Lands in our Territory of QUEENSLAND, Daniel Mossop has become the Purchaser of the Land hereinafter described, for the sum of Sixteen pounds five Shillings Sterling: Paid Before Me. That for and in consideration of the said sum, for and on Our behalf well and truly paid into the Colonial Treasury of Our said Territory, before these Presents are issued, and in further consideration of the Quit-Rent hereinafter Reserved, We, with the advice of Our Executive Council of QUEENSLAND, HAVE GRANTED, and for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, DO HEREBY GRANT unto the said Daniel Mossop his Heirs and Assigns, Subject to the several and responsive Reservations hereinafter mentioned, ALL THAT Piece or Part of Land in Our said Territory, containing by Admeasurement One hundred and twenty acres be the same more or less, situated in the County of Churcliff and Parish of Walloon

Selection Seven hundred and eight Squares District, Portion Four hundred and Thirty five Commencing at the East corner of portion Four hundred and forty three and bounded thence on the Northeast by a line bearing one hundred and forty seven degrees Twenty six chains and fifty seven links to a road on the Southeast by that road and a line its continuation bearing two hundred and thirty six degrees forty five minutes forty five chains and forty six links to another road on the Southwest by that road bearing three hundred and twenty seven degrees twenty six chains and sixty links and on the Northwest by portion Four hundred and forty three bearing fifty seven degrees forty five links and forty seven links to the point of commencement Being the land selected under the 1st Section of the Crown Lands alienation Act of 1868.

With all the Rights and Appurtenances whatsoever thereto belonging: To hold unto the said Daniel Mossop his Heirs and Assigns

for ever, YIELDING and Paying therefore Yearly unto Us, Our Heirs and Successors, the Quit-Rent of One Peppercorn

for ever, if demanded: Provided furtherless, AND WE DO HEREBY RESERVE unto Us, Our Heirs and Successors, all such parts and so much of the said Land as may hereafter be required for making Public Ways, Canals, or Railroads, in, over, and through the same, to be set out by Our Governor for the time being of Our said Territory, or some person by him authorized in that respect; AND ALSO, all Sand, Clay, Stone, Gravel, and Indigenous Timber, and all other Materials, the natural produce of the said Land, which may be required at any time or times hereafter for the construction and repair of any Public Ways, Bridges, Canals, and Railroads, or any Fences, Embankments, Dams, Sewers, or Drains necessary for the same, together with the right of taking and removing all such Materials; AND WE DO HEREBY FURTHER RESERVE unto Us, our Heirs and Successors, the right of fall and free ingress, egress, and regress, into, out of, and upon the said Land, for the several purposes aforesaid. In Testimony Whereof, We have caused this Our Grant to be Sealed with the Seal of Our said Territory.
