(A.) LAND PURCHASE.

County Chardill PICTORIA, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and
Parish Balloon Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, and so forth.—

Date of 8th April 1879
Purchase to all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:—
Area 80 acres

WHEREAS, in conformity with the Regulations now in force for the Sale of Crown Lands in our Territory of QUEENSLAND,

James Rounting has become the Purchaser of the Land hereinafter described, for the Sum of Twelve pounds ten shillings Sterling: Now Know Ye, That for and in consideration of the said Sum, for and on Our behalf well and truly paid into the Colonial Treasury of Our said Territory, before these Presents are issued, and in further consideration of the Quit-Rent hereinafter Reserved, We, with the advice of Our Executive Council of QUEENSLAND, HAVE GRANTED, and for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, Do HEREBY GRANT unto the said James Rounting his Heirs and Assigns, Subject to the several and respective Reservations hereinafter mentioned, ALL THAT Piece or Parcel of Land in Our said Territory, containing by Admeasurement eighty acres be the same more or less, situated in the County of Chardill and Parish of Balloon

Selection 2164, Ipswich District Portion Five hundred and twenty Commencing on a road at the North corner of portion five hundred and nineteen and bounded thence on the Southeast by that portion bearing two hundred and forty Degrees forty eight chains and fifty links on the Southwest by a line bearing three hundred and thirty degrees sixteen chains and sixty links on the Northwest by a line bearing sixty degrees forty eight chains twenty seven links and three quarters of a link and on the Northeast by the aforesaid road bearing one hundred and six degrees fifty six minutes fifty six links and one hundred and eighty degrees sixteen chains and nineteen links to the point of commencement. Being the land Selected under the 71st Section of the Crown Lands alienation Act of 1860.

With all the Rights and Appurtenances whatsoever thereto belonging: To hold unto the said James Rounting his Heirs and Assigns for ever, Yielding and Paying therof Yearly unto Us, Our Heirs and Successors, the Quit-Rent of One Puppercorn

for ever, if demanded: Precincts Liberties, AND WE DO HEREBY RESERVE unto Us, Our Heirs and Successors, all such parts and so much of the said Land as may hereafter be required for making Public Ways, Canals, or Railroads, in, over, and through the same, to be set out by Our Governor for the time being of Our said Territory, or some person by him authorized in that respect; AND ALSO, all Sand, Clay, Stone, Gravel, and indigenous Timber, and all other Materials, the natural produce of the said Land, which may be required at any time or times hereafter for the construction and repair of any Public Ways, Bridges, Canals, and Railroads, or any Fences, Embankments, Dams, Sewers, or Drains necessary for the same, together with the right of taking and removing all such Materials; AND WE DO HEREBY FURTHER RESERVE unto Us, our Heirs and Successors, the right of full and free ingress, egress, and regress, into, out of, and upon the said Land, for the several purposes aforesaid. In Testimony Whereof, We have caused this Our Grant to be Sealed with the Seal of Our said Territory.
